

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) EXAMINATIONS

This document indicates how transfer credit is awarded for Advanced Placement (AP) examinations. Please note that the following rules and regulations only apply to students admitted to a degree program and who are registered in the **John H. Daniels Faculty of Architecture, Landscape, and Design** during the **2017/18** academic year.

1	A maximum of 3.0 full credits may be granted provided a grade of at least 4 is achieved in each AP exam.	
2	In order to receive credit, final results must be sent electronically from the College Board to Enrolment Services by no later than July 14, 2017 . Details on how to request your AP scores can be found at apcentral.collegeboard.org/scores/score-reporting . The school code for the University of Toronto is 0982. 3	If you have taken more than one exam in the same discipline, only 1.0 full credit will be given as students are not permitted to apply more than one first year credit in the same discipline towards their degree. For example, if you have taken AP World History and AP European History, you will receive one HIS credit only.	
4	If you wish to decline or forfeit the transfer credits awarded to you, you must consult the Office of the Registrar and Student Services no later than May 31, 2018 . The option to forfeit is only available to students who have not attended another post-secondary institution. Once forfeited, transfer credits cannot be reinstated.	
5	If you choose to forfeit but you were given two half credits, you will forfeit both half credits.

TERMS DEFINED

Breadth Requirements: Courses in the John H. Daniels Faculty of Architecture, Landscape, and Design and the Faculty of Arts and Science are classified into five Breadth categories by subject content (note that some courses are not designated and do not count toward this requirement). The purpose of the Breadth Requirement is to ensure all students graduating with a degree from the Daniels Faculty have chosen courses across a broad range of subject areas in the Faculty as part of their undergraduate education.

1. Creative and Cultural Representations (CCR)
2. Thought, Belief, and Behaviour (TBB)
3. Society and Its Institutions (SII)
4. Living Things and Their Environment (LTE)
5. The Physical and Mathematical Universes (PMU)

Unspecified transfer credit: A course that has no exact equivalency in the Faculty. For example, ARC1**H1 represents an unspecified first year credit in Architecture. Unspecified credits may be used to meet prerequisite, program or breadth requirements as long as permission is obtained from the relevant Program Director or the Office of the Registrar and Student Services.

Subjects not listed below may still be considered for transfer credit. The Daniels Faculty reserves the right to change transfer credit policies without notice
